Organized by the Society for Environmental Economics and Policy Studies (SEEPS)

In 2021, the Society for Environmental Economics and Policy Studies (SEEPS) launched a new event called the SEEPS Camp. Following the success of the three online SEEPS Camps, we are happy to announce to hold the first in-person **SEEPS Camp 2023** in August. The purpose of the Camp is to bring together a small group of outstanding Ph.D. students and young researchers who will lead the SEEPS in the future and to provide them with opportunities to interact with each other. We further aim at building a network among them who aspire to be leading environmental economists

Participants will present their research plans or outcomes and exchange ideas. They will also join a special session and discuss with mid-career researchers of the SEEPS who will share their experiences of an academic career development. The camp will be held in the Nasushiobara area, Tochigi Prefecture. We will have an opportunity to interview Nasushiobara city, one of the "Decarbonization Leading Area", chosen by Ministry of the Environment. Nikko National Park, which is registered as Zero Carbon Park, also straddles this area. Participants will stay in the cottage with rooftop solar PV in Looop Resort NASU with the concept of "symbiosis between people, forests, and energy".

The applicants would be a Ph.D. student, a business person who has received a master's degree within the past eight years, or an early career researcher who has received a Ph.D. within the past five years at the time of the application.

Non-members of SEEPS and those living outside Japan are also welcome, although the travel cost to Japan is not provided.
